
networked with other members.

Please note that the packet currently states the deadline for applications as October 30, 2021. In an effort to increase submissions, we will allow applications to be submitted until November 10, 2021.

DISTINGUISHED MEMBER AWARD

The highest recognition of notable and outstanding professional achievement and service to the Indiana Section of ITE is receiving the Distinguished Member Award. The Distinguished Member Award is awarded annually as an honorary designation presented to a member of the Section who has provided outstanding and significant contributions to the Indiana Section of ITE over a period of many years. The award will be presented to the winner at the ITE Indiana Section Annual Holiday Gathering in early December.

TRANSPORTATION PROFESSIONAL OF THE YEAR AWARD

The Indiana Section of ITE established the Transportation of the Year Award to recognize an individual who has made outstanding contributions to the Indiana Section of ITE through achievements in the transportation/traffic engineering profession. The award will be presented to the winner at the ITE Indiana Section Annual Holiday Gathering in early December.

TRANSPORTATION ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The Transportation Achievement Award may be awarded annually for excellence in the advancement of transportation to meet human needs, by entities concerned with transportation such as governmental agencies, legislative bodies, consulting firms, and other organizations. - Program or project promoting a major advancement in the efficiency and/or economy of transportation.

RISING STAR AWARD

Transportation Systems Management and Operations Category

The winning project is the Main Avenue Reconstruction Project, Fargo, MN submitted by Ron Henke at the North Dakota Department of Transportation, Jeremy Gorden at the City of Fargo, and Matt Pacyna from SRF Consulting Group.

Fargo's Main Avenue, also known as US Highway 10, serves as an arterial connection between West Fargo, Fargo, and Moorhead, Constructed in the 1950s, this full stretch of Main Avenue is one of the oldest roads in Fargo. The purpose of the project was to mitigate identified system deficiencies such as deteriorating pavement, old water and sanitary systems, sidewalk and ADA compliance, delays associated with atgrade train crossings, and intersection safety. A key objective was to not only reconstruct the roadway and update its underground utility infrastructure, but to provide opportunities for an enhanced business environ-

The winning project is the I-35/ Bayfront Traffic Study, Duluth MN submitted by Ron Chica at the Duluth Superior Metropolitan Interstate Council and Nick VanGunst from Alliant Engineering. The objective for this project was to develop improved wayfinding, ITS and operational short - and long-term solutions to address issues with congestion and traffic delays into and out of the Bayfront/ **DECC/Canal Park areas during** events, including utilization and reconfiguration of the local roadway system and the adjacent section of I-35 and separation of industrial traffic from commercial/residential traffic. The final recommended improvements included the use to technology to improve wayfinding to available

parking, provide real time parking availability, provide advance notification of congested routes and suggest alternative routes, modify parking operations at the DECC/AMSOIL and several other lots to help reduce congestion at the lot entrances, improved bike and pedes-trian facilities, increased transit options and provide transit dedicated routes to and from the event site, and roadway infrastructure improvements/geometric changes.

Safety category

The winning project is the St. Paul Speed Limit Signing & Signal Clearance Intervals Projects, St. Paul, MN submitted by Randy Newton at the City of St. Paul and Mike McCurdy at Alliant Engineering. In May 2019, Governor Tim Walz signed legislation giving all cities in Minnesota new speed limit authority, which took effect on August 1, 2019. The City of St. Paul carefully reviewed their roadway system and moved to adjust speed limits to 20 mph for local residential streets; 25 mph for larger, arterial and collector city-owned streets; and 30-plus mph for a few city-owned streets. Per Minnesota law, the City does not have authority to change the speed limits on county or MnDOT roadways. The City of St. Paul hired Alliant Engineering to develop plans for City forces to install the new speed limit signage as well as perform measurements and calculations for the revised signal timinas.

The new speed limits resulted in the need to replace approximately 750 existing speed limit signs and revise speed based timing parameters at the City's 430 traffic signals. The signing strategy that Saint Paul prepared in coordination with the City of Minneapolis, was to utilize "gateway signs" at the entry points to both cities. The gateway signs, shown (at right) indicate that the citywide speed limit is 20mph unless otherwise posted. The City of St. Paul also strategically decided to utilize existing speed limit sign locations as much as possible for the new 25 mph sign locations. As a result, City staff would simply need to swap the inplace speed limit sign (most commonly a 30 mph sign) with the new 25 mph sign. The strategy for the signal retiming effort was to measure intersection characteristics and compute new clearance interval values for implementation in step with the sign revisions.

The project was unique because it impacted all vehicular traffic within the City of St. Paul as well as non-motorized users at signalized intersections. It was very high profile with significant public support and media attention. The City was under tremendous pressure to implement the revised speed limits in a short period of time which was compounded by the COVID-19 pandemic. The project team worked with an accelerated schedule and managed to deliver signing and timing plans on schedule despite the remote workplace challenges. The project required a unique collaborative team effort between the City signing department, City traffic operations department, and staff at Alliant Engineering. The team worked together to review and implement the revised signal timings in conjunction with coordinating the speed limit signing installations with field crews.

figurations, steel faced curb, and building attached canopies that overhang the public way and were meant to provide protection against the weather during loading. It is part of Chicago's first Innovation District (and one of the first such overlaying land use designations in the nation). The Innovation District is intended to provide a coordinated land use plan where both traditional and innovative businesses can coexist and experience economic growth.

DISTRICT STUDENT WINS ITE DIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP

The following interview with Aaron Sesay, ITE Consultants and Industry Council Diversity Scholar, and ITE Student Chapter member at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities, is extracted from the member to member section of the ITE Journal (ITEJ).

ITEJ: Tell us about yourself, your family, hobbies, and/or interests.

AARON SESAY: I recently graduated from Apple Valley High School in Apple Valley, MN, USA, where I prioritized my academics and graduated with honors, but I also was involved in a lot of school activities. In general, my activities fell under three categories: service, music, and STEM. My service activities included the Interact Club, National Honor Society, and Student Council. I liked these clubs because I love to volunteer and help others. I was even recognized with a National Community Service Awards Ambassador Award during my senior year for completing over 100 volunteer/service hours.

One of the reasons I'm passionate about helping others and solving real-world problems is because of my dad. My dad is the founder and CEO of a new nonprofit organization called FASE (Foundation for African Social Entrepreneurship). It emphasizes socially innovative solutions for sustainable development.

I developed a partnership with FASE and my Interact Club. One of the projects I started through this partnership was an annual school supply drive for Sierra Leone. With the first school supply drive, we collected enough school supplies for about 400 students in Sierra Leone. It feels great to make an impact, and that is one of the main reasons

Although I've gotten lots of fulfillment from the activities I've participated in, my family is more important, and they have been the foundation for my education as well as my spiritual and moral development. My family consists of my mom, dad, older brother, and younger sister. My older brother has autism, and he is mostly nonverbal and faces extreme behavioral challenges. This has brought challenges to my family, but we all love and support him, and he has helped us all be more patient and thoughtful people.

ITEJ: How did you become interested in engineering?

SESAY: I have been interested in activities related to STEM from a young age. I have always been fascinated with building things and playing with technology. Legos were my favorite type of toy growing up. I would have fun spending countless hours making Lego airplanes, cars, and houses. Spending time building these structures was exciting to me and gave me a sense of achievement.

Although I love STEM concepts in engineering, the aspect of engineering that is the most captivating to me is the opportunity to help others. My mom and dad were born in Ghana and Sierra Leone, respectively. I feel very connected to the culture of these countries and have always been interested in solving the problems in the impoverished areas of these countries such as food insecurity, polluted water, unequal access to education, and more using a STEM approach.

For example, in 9th grade I researched the 2017 mudslide in Sierra Leone for a school project. Over 1,000 people were killed and thousands were left homeless. I believe the effects could have been less drastic if there were more sustainable and innovative solutions/regulations put into year has place by engineers in advance. The fact that engineers can solve huge real-world problems like this is intriguing to me.

ITEJ: What are you looking most forward to about going to college?

SESAY: I am looking forward to the amazing educational opportunities in college. I will get more exposure and go deeper into engineering studies because of the variety of hands-on activities I will be able to do in the advanced learning facilities. I am also looking forward to strengthening my responsibility and independence skills, as this will be my first time living away from my house for such a long time.

ITEJ: How do you think the ITE Diversity Scholars Program will support you?

SESAY: I am beyond grateful for the ITE Diversity Scholarship. I've always known that I want to go to college, but I haven't always been sure how I'd pay for it. The ITE diversity scholarship will allow me to further my studies without worries about my financial situation.

ITEJ: How do you think being a part of ITE can help you?

SESAY: Being a part of ITE will give me easy access to opportunities that I didn't know would be this accessible in college, such as internship and mentoring opportunities. As an incoming freshman pursuing a career in engineering, these sound like wonderful opportunities, and I am looking forward to being involved in them.
